SOCIAL STUDIES:

The Five Themes of Geography provide the framework for World Regional Studies in seventh grade. Students apply the tools of geography and consider civics, economics, history, culture, and current events as they use a wide range of resource materials to study the regions of Europe and Russia, the Middle East, and Asia.

- Write routinely over extended time frames (time for research, reflection, and revision) and shorter time frames (a single sitting or a day or two) for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences.
- Adapt speech to a variety of contexts and tasks, demonstrating command of formal English when indicated or appropriate.
- Acquire and use accurately grade-appropriate general academic and domain-specific words and phrases; gather vocabulary knowledge when considering a word or phrase important to comprehension or expression.
